We invite you to join us at our **No Tech Tuesday Challenge Student Award Assembly**, at which we will hear about the how our 8th and 9th grade students fared in their commitment to having NO screen time of any kind for each of the eleven Tuesdays of the summer break — Tuesday, June 13 through Tuesday, August 22, 2017. With each No-Tech-Tuesday, students in the Challenge experienced life without any of the everpresent screens so integral to our modern life.

Of the 160 students who were eligible to participate in the Challenge, about half attempted at least one screen-free Tuesday, and 30 so far have claimed they were successful in staying off screens for all 11 Tuesdays. Other Latin students and some of our parents also participated, though they are not eligible for the \$100 award.

The Principal of Washington Latin, Dr. Diana Smith, issued the Challenge to students in June at the end-of-year Valediction ceremony, driven by her concern about what she considers a growing problem for students in effectively setting limits on their use of all kinds of technology devices. Seeing how smart phones, tablets, video games and other screens have changed students' habits, particularly in terms of their peer interactions, led her to issue this Challenge.

To participate, students must have stayed off all screens for 24 hours each Tuesday over summer break, share their experiences and reflections from the Challenge in writing, and bring Dr. Smith written confirmation from two adults attesting that the student successfully met the Challenge.

For each student who demonstrates successful completion of the Challenge, Dr. Smith will award \$100 of her own money. Appropriately, Dr. Smith gave up her cable TV subscription several months ago to begin saving money towards student awards.
