
Our Vision

- Which can serve as a model for exemplary public education.




Current Enrollment







- ✓ Increased our enrollment in AP Physics
- ▲ Added an additional section of Ancient Greek
- Three of our students were awarded scholarships to study in Rome or Greece
- Posse Scholar
- ✓ More than \$6 million in merit scholarships for college



- Our HS had the second highest PMF score of any charter school at any level in the city
 - Tier 1 for each of the past five years
 - Nationally recognized each of the past four years
- ▲ 101 Latin students took 180 A.P. exams in 12 subjects
 - Last year, 98 students took 184 A.P. exams in 11 subjects
- We scored substantially higher than city on SAT performance
 - Oct. test average (Class of 2018): 1068; DC average: 874
 - Class of 2019 average for first sitting: 1088; DC: 883





Seal of Biliteracy

- Award that recognizes a student's high level of proficiency in listening, speaking, reading and writing in one (or more) language(s) other than English.
- Will be included on a student's transcript
- First charter school to adopt this





Mathematics

- Hired ¹/₂ time resource teacher for pull-out and push-in instruction
- Expanded Muffins and Math program; added three afternoon sessions in addition to the daily morning offerings
- Identified students with PARCC scores of 1 and 2 and devised individualized plans to help them
- Used Dreambox Learning to offer personalized instruction that promotes student decision making and strategy development



Middle School Reading & Writing

- ◀ Intensive vocabulary instruction for all students.
- ✓ Targeted reading goals for identified students in English classes
- Reading of class novels (not leveled) as well as leveled books so students have more access to the material
- ▲ Actively teaching annotation skills and reading analysis skills.
- Identifying students reading significantly below grade level
- ▲ ASTRA classes:
 - Specialist
 - Intensive vocabulary work
 - Development of reading skills
 - Support of current class work






Key Performance Indicators
