LATIN'S GUIDING PRINCIPLES



- Safety This is first, with a focus on the common good a teachable moment!
- **Quality** content and teaching continue to be our norm.
- **Equity** is a top priority; we will do all possible to meet needs, (NB: not necessarily *equality* or same for all).
- **Clarity** is an essential tool. We will make expectations clear and engage and communicate often with students, families, and faculty.
- Flexibility is required. Change is the constant! We must learn and adapt as we go.





A flood of information, counsel and official guidance

- Rules from OSSE, DC Health, DC Mayor
 - MAYOR rules about all schools reopening, gatherings, masks
 - **DC HEALTH DEPARTMENT -** requirements for health checks, COVID reporting, quarantining, individual school closing, etc.
 - **OSSE** (Office of the State Superintendent of Education) rules about # students/classroom, distancing (desks, people in line)
- Guidance from CDC, American Pediatrics, State Board of Education, Federal Department of Education
- **Counsel** from DC, national, global experts, and peers through media, partner organizations' trainings, etc.





Our plan must work for individuals and the whole community.

PARENTS

- Surveyed by Mayor's office and Latin about fall options
- Also asked about spring Distance Learning what worked, what didn't, what is important for children's success
- We heard: more *structure*, more *synchronous*, more *social*

FACULTY

- Surveyed all faculty twice, and talked individually to many
- Range of views, including growing concern about oncampus classes

RECENT PANDEMIC CHANGES



- Since June, DMV and the US have seen **changes in the pandemic.**
 - **New infections in the US** have averaged 66,000 in last week, up from average of 22,000 in first week of June.
 - Community spread in DC seems to be increasing
- As a result, state/local **reopening plans are changing**, including for schools.
 - Nationally Most big districts are not ready to reopen due to above-ideal (5%) infection rates and many have announced a remote start for 2020-21.
 - DC region Montgomery, PG, Arlington, Fairfax, Falls Church have all announced remote instruction in fall; DCPS will announce on 7/31



FALL ACADEMIC PLANS

How will Latin reopen in August? How will this work?



We will reopen 2020 with all virtual classes.

- We plan on *re-evaluating at 5-week* mark (10/1) to see if we can add more in-person classes.
- At most, we are committing to this plan for Quarter 1 ONLY.
- That is, we HOPE to be back on campus soon and thus are not announcing a longer period of DL now.

Based on faculty and parent feedback, we have an *improved Distance Learning model* with more synchronous learning and daily structure (especially for younger students)

We will gradually add in-person elements.

- Start with a small number of US classes on campus
- Also find ways to address academic interventions, mental health counseling, ELL support, etc.



Grouped in *learning pods of 11-12 students for each class*.

- Small groups better for DL
- Will ease eventual transition to on-campus learning

Schedule built around **75-minute learning blocks**

MS ACADEMIC SUPPORT



What if a student needs help or support?

- **Students can email teachers during learning block.** For students who have questions or need help with the lesson, they can email the teacher.
- **Tutorial will be offered M,T,Th,F.** Additional help is offered, as usual, after classes end (all but Wednesday).
- Support for students needing regular/more help will also be provided. This includes reading (ASTRA), math, English Language, and Special Education/IEP support. Details TBD
- Advisories (separate from pods) will meet daily and have weekly lunch to provide social connection and support.

US PLAN - ACADEMICS



Virtual schedule built around 90-minute learning blocks

US Learning Block



Two-hour flex periods on Tuesday and Fridays for tutorial, meetings, clubs

Advisories will meet 4 days/week and have Wednesday (8th) or Friday (9-12th) lunch.

ADDING IN-PERSON ACTIVITIES



GRADUAL introduction of in-person activities at school

• We will ensure safety and test operational approaches.

Will **only** involve teachers and students who are on board.

Stage 1: small number of US classes + some individuals

- Depending on interest, could start early in year
- Will use outdoor classrooms as much as possible
- IEP/504, ELL and at-risk students also may come to school to complete virtual work with case manager or other faculty

Additional options may include

- Limited social or extra-curricular events
- NB: fall sports season has been postponed DC-wide



HEALTH & SAFETY

How will Latin protect health and safety of students and faculty on campus?

What have we planned or accomplished to ready the campus for in-person activities?

WORKING NOW FOR RE-OPENING

COVID-safe

means change to school operations in 5 major categories:







Limit how many are on campus

- A maximum of 11 students per classroom six feet apart (by current regulations, may change)
- Drastically reduce access to building by visitors (parents, deliveries, etc.)

Track health and symptoms of those on-campus

- Initiate daily health screening using Latin-developed app and in-person evaluation (including temperature checks) before building entry
- Isolate symptomatic students until picked up
- Limit return of COVID-exposed for 14 days or with negative test (per Health Department regulation)

PPE & HYGIENE



Masks will be required for all in the building.

- Teachers may also use face shields as well as masks.
- Students will need masks; breaks outside permissible with health reasons (e.g., asthma).
- Latin will have masks for anyone without their own.

Hygiene procedures also required.

- Hand-washing, hand-sanitizing, etc. incorporated into daily routines on campus.
- Signage will be posted (in hallways, bathrooms) reminding students of good hygiene practices.
- Water fountains for refilling water bottles only.

REDUCE CONTACT



Limit direct contact and mingling.

- Students assigned to learning pods of 11 or fewer (MS) and limit contact if changing classes (US)
- Student pods remain in classrooms; teachers travel.
- Break, lunch, etc. with pod, not mingled
- Students and faculty maintain physical distance

Limit indirect contact.

- Building traffic patterns managed to limit contact
- Provide teachers with personal school supplies and PPE to carry with them throughout day
- Add plexiglass dividers in high-traffic public-facing areas
- Stagger arrival and dismissal times with modified protocols to increase distancing at drop-off and pick-up

CLEAN AND BREATHE



Clean. Repeat.

- Assign bathrooms to specific pods and clean after use by pods; close every other stall/sink and rotate stalls daily
- Increase cleaning, disinfecting and sanitizing protocols (daily, weekly, and monthly)
- Increase cleaning during the day of high-touch surfaces
- Deep clean twice weekly

Improve air flow and filtering. And also take it outside!

- Upgrade air filters to recommended MERV13 standard
- Increase draw of exterior air into building
- Open doors and windows to increase air circulation
- Create outdoor classrooms on field



EQUITY & INCLUSION

ENSURING EQUITY



Commitments to equity remain our priority.

- Providing devices for 1:1 technology and supporting internet access
- Working to ensure IEP/504 and ELL students have regular contact with case managers.
- Providing counseling to students individually and in groups
- Adding to our parent engagement team to facilitate communications and ensure engagement for ALL families

We continue to seek donations to the Emergency Fund to help students and families in need this year.

MORE DETAIL ON 1:1 TECH



For academic reasons and to ensure equity, Latin will provide a device for each student.

Goal for fall: Distribute a school device to each student

Challenge: Delay in receiving enough Chromebooks for distribution in August

Interim plan: Close gaps with current inventory of Chromebooks according to a need-based priority list:

- Students in need (those qualifying for Free & Reduced Meals)
- Students with academic needs IEP/504, English Language Learner status, etc.
- By grade, starting in 5th

DIVERSITY IN OUR MODEL



Latin was established as an **intentionally diverse school**.

We remain **one of DC's most diverse schools** - racially and socioeconomically.

Our model relies on the **diversity of perspective**, which often reflects diversity of background and experience

Our philosophical moorings, pedagogical approach and relational norms enable us to **facilitate connections across difference** and make it possible for civil discourse and authentic engagement



Latin's mission depends on diversity:

- Only within a truly integrated school community that students become thoughtful people who will contribute to the public good and continue a lifelong quest towards a fuller humanity
- As individuals and as a school community, we must continually question how well we are living out that mission and how well we are preparing our students to contribute to the public good.
- We need to recommit to our core principles while engaging in deeper conversations, self-reflection, and intentional actions.

PLANS FOR THIS YEAR



- Develop more DEI-focused talent practices (e.g., recruiting for diverse pools, removing hiring biases, enabling all staff members to feel comfortable bringing their "whole selves" to work)
- Continue and expand student **Dialogues Across Difference**
- Help teachers to facilitate meaningful conversations about race in the classroom
- Add alumni representatives to our Council on Diversity and Equity (CODE)
- Use our speaker series to engage the community in dialogue about DEI
- Revise the school's diversity plan and share it broadly
- Develop task forces for staff and alumni
