• Registering for Classes

- o If you have plans to be part of Summer School and have not yet registered, you must do so ASAP!
- Upper School

- As a reminder that all Upper School courses are credit bearing and the grades earned will become part of a student's official transcript.
 - US students may only be enrolled in ONE class at a time during any Session.
- Course Breakdowns:
 - <u>Full credit courses</u> Duration: 5 Weeks (Session 1 and Session 2), the equivalent of the regular year-long offerings during the school year.
 - For example, year long English or Math courses for Grade Recovery.
 - o Ms. Brady will reach out to students requiring English or Math Credit Recovery.
 - <u>Half-credit courses (Electives)</u> Duration 2.5 weeks, Session 1 or Session 2) the equivalent of a regular single-semester offering during the school year.

- <u>US Schedule</u>
- *Special Schedules:
 - Art (Session 2, will meet virtually for two days July 15-16, in person July 19-22, and virtually July 27-30.)
 - DC History is offered virtually at two different times in both sessions.
 - Mr. Eleby El will teach one class daily 8:30-1:30.
 - Mr. Price will teach another class at the later time of 1:30pm-6pm daily.
 - Several students recovering both English and Math will have morning and afternoon classes through 3:30pm.

 - Each session is 12 days including asynchronous days. All US courses meet three times daily. US **electives** run an entire session, while US grade recovery in English and Math. Note we have added a "four" day weekend in each session to accommodate summer travel.
