Vaccine Updates

- DC businesses may now require customers to show a vax card before entering (as of 1/15/2022).
- Washington Latin requests that you send your children's updated cards as they move through doses/boosters.
- See the Google form we will share tomorrow in *Legenda*.

DC Health vaccine clinic at Latin on *Tuesday 2/1/2022*

- Bring the card OR printed copy of the card
- Minors <u>must</u> be accompanied by parent/guardian from registration through vaccine administration.
 - Come with your child (no form necessary) **OR**
 - Authorize a trusted adult with a signed, printed form with a temporary guardian (e.g., another Latin parent, relative, etc.)

Results from Return-to-School Tests

Data as of January 05, 2022, at the end of our on-campus testing

Division	Negative	Positive	Quarantine	Total Students	No Result	Percent Tested	Quarantine Rate
Middle School	351	10	12	377	4	99%	6%
High School	334	16	9	365	6	98%	7%
All	685	26	21	742	10	99%	6%

- Quarantine rate includes already in quarantine or tested positive at Latin and thus began quarantine last week.
- Any *non-results* were students who were out of town and unable to test on those days.
- ALL students have been tested if they are back in school!

Plan for In-School Testing

Antigen Testing - NEW addition to our COVID toolbox

- Previous restrictions on this kind of testing have been lifted or changed recently.
- **Benefits** include getting immediate results to take appropriate action.
- *Challenges* include the costs and coverage for the testing (an evolving situation!)
- PCR tests will continue to be part of strategy as well.

Current (tentative) plan - through spring break

- Latin will provide antigen tests for all students (regardless of vaccination status) every other week on campus.
- There is *no cost to families*, though Latin will need to fund the tests.
- DC government is providing kits for weekly testing of faculty.
- Latin will inform parents of any positive result ASAP, and students will need to leave campus as quickly as possible.

So what happens if?

...my child at Latin tests positive at home?

- Contact Martita Fleming to report the result.
- Work with Latin to determine close contacts.
- DC health may also follow up with you directly.
- Follow DC's quarantining rules (see below).

...my child at tests positive at school?

- Latin will report positive results (not negative) as soon as possible.
- The student will need to go home immediately. Please see above.

After a positive test: Quarantine period in DC is 10 days OR until symptom-free for anyone who tests positive.

- Vaccinated contacts no quarantine if test negative and are asymptomatic
- Unvaccinated contacts
 - Quarantine for 10 days OR
 - Quarantine for 5 days, test negative on Day 5 or later → may return on Day 7.



So what happens if....?



...my child shows any symptoms?

Any symptom - including (but not limited to) fever, runny nose, vomiting, serious and otherwise unexplained headache - indicates illness and *your child should stay home!*

...my child had symptoms at 8:00 pm but seems better this morning?

Please keep them home for **24-hours symptom-free** before returning to school!

Remember the old Mother Goose nursery rhyme:

Symptom-free all day & night helps us win the COVID fight!

What about school during a quarantine?



- If quarantined students are sick, they should rest and recover.
- If quarantined students are asymptomatic, they cannot return until **ALL** of these are true:
 - The student has been asymptomatic for 24 hours.
 (Symptom-free all day and night helps us win the COVID fight!)
 - The full 10 days of quarantine have passed.
 - Their antigen test is negative (taken at home or upon return to campus).

Students healthy enough to do academics in quarantine receive additional support!

Our goals

- *Minimize academic consequences* by ensuring access to assignments, materials and faculty
- **Sustain engagement** by providing academic and mental health support, as needed

January 18, 2022 Return to Athletics with caveats

- Some sports will return to competition, others will continue to hold.
- All athletes will get full credit for this season.
- Masks will be required for all athletes at all times *except* during <u>active competition</u>.
 Latin encourages them at all times.
- No spectators are allowed at any event.
- **PLAYERS & PARENTS** watch for coach emails this week with specifics.

BASKETBALL

- Varsity (boys & girls) Practices restart Tuesday 1/18 and games will resume soon.
- JV (US boys) & MS (boys & girls) Practices will restart next week (details TBD). Games are suspended except a single end-of-season tournament.
