Tutorial: What is it?

- Tutorial is *an opportunity for students to receive specific support* from their teachers.
- Students may decide they want help from a teacher, or a teacher may ask them to come to tutorial to discuss.
- Students should come *prepared with specific questions* related to a lesson or an assignment.

What are the details?

- Tutorial occurs Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays from 3:15-3:45.
- Student should plan to arrive at the start and stay for the full tutorial period.
- There is **no tutorial on Wednesdays or Fridays**, nor on half days.



Cooper's New Positive Behavior Support System

Starting after Labor Day, the Cooper campus will implement a new system to support students and staff.

- Students will *receive demerits for behaviors that deviate from our school culture*, such as being late to class, using non-permitted devices, disrupting lessons, using foul language, or leaving class without permission.
- Receiving *four or more demerits in the course of one week will earn students a detention*. Detentions last one hour and occur on Wednesdays from 3:30 to 4:30.
- Serving two or more Wednesday detentions in a month will result in a student serving a Saturday detention with Ms. Roberts.



Operations Updates



MAGIS@Cooper - Afterschool Program

Through MAGIS@Cooper we seek to provide a safe, structured space where students can receive enrichment after classes end.

- Participants in MAGIS @ Cooper will have the opportunity to engage in a variety of programs throughout the 2023-24 school year.
- MAGIS @ Cooper will *serve students Monday through Thursday until 6:00 pm*. The program is not offered on Fridays, school holidays, nor half-days.

- Storybook Writing competition (seasonal opportunity; more details will be forthcoming)
- Coloring Club, meets twice per week


Joint Campus Project
