Buses & Transportation

All students are eligible for Kids Ride Free cards, which provide unlimited rides on the city's bus and metro systems. In addition, Washington Latin offers charter bus service to and from both campuses with morning and afternoon service, plus a late bus from 2nd Street. We also offer a shuttle service from 2nd Street to the Cooper Campus in the mornings and back again in the afternoons (fee-based, but less expensive than the buses.)

Buses arrive at and depart designated stops convenient for the majority of our families, generally including the following areas: Hillcrest/ Anacostia, Glover Park, Tenleytown, and Eastern Market. This is not a door-to-door service, and families are responsible for ensuring the student arrives at the bus stop and has a plan to get from the bus stop to home.

This service costs \$2,600 annually per student for full-time users. We regularly prorate the cost for those using the service on a part-time basis (one way, one season, only two days per week, etc.) ***The bus service is free for students whose families qualify for free or reduced meals (FARMS).***

Uniforms

We require all students to wear uniforms and adhere to the Uniform Policy at all times while in the school building and at school-sponsored functions. The basic Latin uniform consists of khaki (tan) or navy blue bottoms and a collared white, gray, or navy shirt with the Latin logo.

Meal Service

At both campuses, we offer free breakfast to all students any day school is in session. Each campus offers a prepared lunch delivered by *Luncheras DiSi* at the Cooper Campus and *Genuine Foods* at the 2nd Street Campus.

Lunch is free for qualifying students and \$4.50 per lunch for all others. We bill for lunch quarterly based on each student's consumption, so we can always feed students who request lunch without regard to current payment status. We also always offer free fruit and milk throughout the day to all students.

Afterschool Care: MAGIS

MAGIS is our afterschool program for Middle School students.

- **At 2nd Street**, MAGIS offers a place for homework, reading, and board games.
- **At Cooper**, MAGIS includes a range of programs that includes creative writing and other arts, homework help, and community council.

At both campuses, MAGIS runs from dismissal until 6:00 pm every Monday through Thursday, but not on Fridays, half days, or school holidays. We do not offer before-school care.
