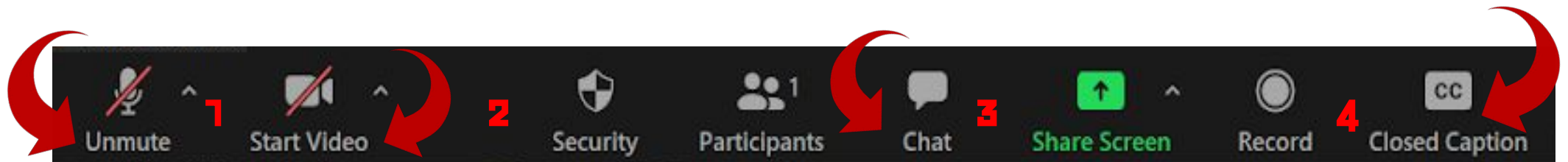

Fall in Love with Enduring Ideas

Our education is an invitation to fall in love with deep, enduring ideas - Truth, Beauty and Goodness - and so to be changed. We believe that education should be transformational, involving both mind and heart; at their union character develops. Our curriculum introduces students to truths beyond their context yet within their grasp; our pedagogy of questioning opens ideas to critique and encourages students to wrestle with timeless ideas to make them their own.



Middle Schoolers and Adolescence

- ***Challenges of pre-teen and teenage years*** - Identity development, pushing away from adults, formation of cliques
- ***Our response*** - Embrace the individual, surround them with strong adult role models, leverage opportunities for students to find belonging within the broader group
 - Involve each student in “the life of the school”
 - Clubs, Dialogues Across Difference, YES curriculum, overnight field trips like Echo Hill

English Curriculum - Overview

Washington Latin's curriculum emphasizes ***broad reading, engaged writing,*** and ***civil speech*** across subjects.

- Teachers select a variety of works - ***ancient and modern*** - particularly ***original texts***. Examples (these vary year to year): ancient works (*Antigone, The Odyssey*); modern classics (*Things Fall Apart, To Kill a Mockingbird*); graphic novels (*Maus, The March*).
- We provide ***intensive support in reading and writing*** through intensive Academic Support/Intensive classes + Peer Tutoring.



Latin

- Students who enroll with us in 5th grade take a total of five years of Latin:
 - 5th grade and 6th grade: survey classes focused on vocabulary acquisition, mythology, and history
 - 7th grade: Latin I (for high school credit)
 - 8th grade: Latin I (for high school credit)
 - 9th grade: Latin III/IV or Honors Latin III/IV (for high school credit)
- Students can continue to pursue Latin beyond the requirement. **Spring break international travel** is available to students in Latin V and beyond.



History

- History is an essential part of our program and is explored both within and beyond the History classroom.
 - 5th graders study Geography and become familiar with the different regions of the world
 - 6th graders study Civics, connecting ancient and modern ideas of government
 - 7th grader study Ancient Civilizations, supporting historical exploration in the Latin classroom
 - 8th graders study US History from Early America through the Civil War; students take US History again in 11th grader studying Reconstruction through contemporary times



World Languages

- Students are required to take two years of a World Language for graduation; students choose between Mandarin Chinese, Arabic, and French.
- Most students enroll in language in 9th grade.
- Students who earn a GPA of a 3.7 or higher in 7th grade may start in 8th grade in place of study hall.



Math Curriculum - Overview

- Washington Latin uses the ***Common Core standards*** to sequence all math courses from 5th grade through Algebra 2.
- Every student has the opportunity to take credit-bearing ***Algebra 1 by 8th grade*** and Calculus by 12th grade.
- We offer ***intensive Math support*** for students who demonstrate a need through diagnostic testing.
Goal: all students are on level by end of 8th grade (or sooner).
 - Math Intensive
 - Peer tutoring program

Arts and Electives

- Beginning in 8th grade, students have the opportunity to choose their elective class. Current offerings are here:
 - One semester of Art and one semester of Theater
 - 8th grade Choir (year-long class)
 - Jazz Band (year-long class)
 - Conflict Resolution (year-long class)
 - Nature Studies (year-long class)
- 7th graders will choose their elective with their advisor in the weeks ahead.



Physical Education/Health & Sports

Athletic participation plays an important role in helping young people develop a healthy self-image and healthy habits.

Requirements for MS

- 5th and 6th - PE + Health
- 7th - 1 season of competitive athletics OR non-competitive classes each year
- 8th - 2 seasons of competitive athletics OR non-competitive classes each year
- Current offerings for Middle School students include:
 - **Fall:** Cross Country, Flag Football, Volleyball, Soccer
 - **Winter:** Basketball, Indoor Track, Swimming
 - **Spring:** Tennis, Baseball, Softball, Ultimate Frisbee, Lacrosse
 - **Classes:** Yoga, Conditioning, Martial Arts (vary by season)



Choice and Advising



- **Beginning in 7th grade**, students have input into their schedule choices for the following school year.
- For **8th grade**, students choose their electives.
- For **9th grade and beyond**, students choose their level of challenge (on-level vs. Honors or AP) and their electives.
- Students meet 1:1 with their advisors each May to choose their courses for the following year.

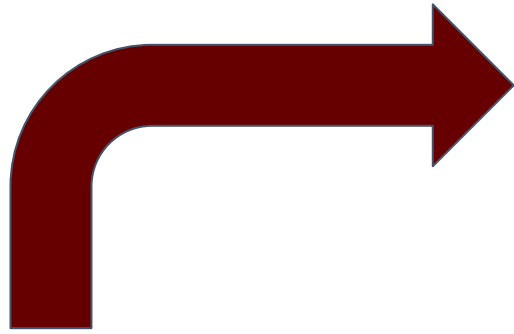


Graduation Requirements

- 4 credits – English
- 4 credits – Math (one year past Algebra II)
- 4 credits – Science
- 4 credits – History
(including DC History and Government)
- 3 credits – Latin (through Latin III)
- 2 credits – Chinese, French or Arabic
(through the second level)
- 3.5 credits – Electives (credits that are above and beyond the minimum and specifically named grad. requirements and are of the student's choosing)
- 0.5 credit - Art
- 0.5 credit – Health
- 0.5 credit – Music
- 0.25 credit – Financial Literacy
- 1 credit – Athletics (four seasons)
- 100 hours – Community Service
