

# Washington Latin Public Charter Schools Parent-Faculty Association (PFA) at 2nd Street

### What does the PFA do?

The PFA supports the school, students, faculty, and parents in a variety of ways:

- Hosts events to bring parents, families, and faculty together
- Funds extra instructional materials for teachers
- Communicates information to parents
- Supports families with services online directory, planners for new 5th graders, graduation signs for seniors, used uniform sale, emergency assistance

#### Where does the PFA get its money? Are there dues?

• Our funding comes from the parents of Washington Latin through our Latin Pride annual campaign each Fall, which also provides important funding to the school to sustain the most important elements of Latin - small classes, excellent faculty, and a warm community.

## Who is my PFA representative for my child's grade?

# Parent-Faculty Association Supported Events

Event	Typical Timing	Description
Back-to School	Weekend before school starts	All-Latin get-together and used uniform sale. <b>PFA staffs</b> the sale table and helps with setup/takedown.
Latin planners	September	PFA pays for Latin planners for 5th and 6th grade students.
Online directory	September	PFA pays for online directory software, one volunteer formats names/addresses for directory.
Parent social	September	Adults-only potluck + drinks, with parents, some faculty, and school leaders. 1-2 PFA volunteers organize.
Fall festival	October	All-Latin PFA-led event - games, activities, food and drink, used uniform sale. Draws more middle schoolers/parents.
Department grants	October	PFA pays for extra student-facing supplies/materials for teachers. Led by PFA VP.
Latin Pride	October November	Latin's big annual fundraiser (and source of PFA funding). PFA helps make calls to parents in their children's grade.
Holiday gifts to	December	Cash gifts to faculty and staff. Organized by PFA treasurer. PFA members help hand-write cards, stuff envelopes.
faculty Parent social	January or February	Adults-only potluck + drinks, with parents, some faculty, and school leaders. 1-2 PFA volunteers organize. This second social happens only occasionally.
Teacher appreciati on week	May	PFA-led event(s) to show some love for Latin teachers. Often involves catered or potluck food. In 2023, also included teacher lounge refresh.
8th grade moving-up reception	June	PFA-led event to celebrate 8th grade valediction. Usually involves some food/drink for students and parents. Organized by 7th grade PFA reps.
Graduation signs	June	PFA pays for graduation signs for graduating seniors. A few PFA volunteers help distribute the signs to seniors' homes.
Graduating senior event/prom support	June	PFA-led event to celebrate graduating seniors. In 2022-23, was a catered party for parents and students that was a big hit. Organized by 11th and 12 grade PFA reps. Also - PFA funds to offset prom ticket prices and to pay for prom extras (e.g., photo booth, favors).
Speakers	All year	PFA pays for, schedules speakers on topics of interest to parents.
