

Text-to-tip technology enables crowdsourced student reporting of dangerous threats or bullying incidents.



Open CommunicationParents, staff and students can stay

informed about general topics, such as report card distribution or safety issues, through notifications.



On-Site Coordination

Instant alerts can be sent to appropriate staff and 9-1-1 by activating a panic button app to coordinate next steps.



Direct integration with 9-1-1 means incident details and location data can be immediately accessed by those arriving on scene.

What schools are experiencing

Social media threats

- Both local and "spam" from anywhere
- DC government (Mayor's office, MPD) working in new ways to support schools'
 - Mayor convened summer meeting with Principals across
 DCPS and DCPCS schools to discuss safety
 - MPD reached out to Latin to directly support safety with presence with September social media scare
- Blessing of NOT having phones in students'
 hands/pockets/bags → less sharing = less amplification of
 message and response (fear, distraction, stress)



What Latin is doing

Building security

- Security at the main entrance
- Landline phones in all classrooms
- Security review by DC/national school security expert
- Safety top concern of new building design (Harewood)


Faculty Training

Project Update

- Latin's new building (Middle School) is on track.
- Renovations to the historic structure (Upper School) are also on track.
- All Cooper grades (5-9) will move to Harewood site for 2025-26 school year!
- Yu Ying is finishing their building with plans to move in December 2024.
- The project is funded through philanthropy and financing.

DC CAPE Highlights



What is DC CAPE?

- Annual test required for all public schools in DC
- Administered each spring in Math and English/Language Arts (ELA) in grades 5-8
- *DC Science test* also in spring for 5th
- A good test of our students' growth and achievement at both individual and school-level
- DC CAPE is also used in *rating schools*, including Latin






Overall DC CAPE Performance - Cooper Campus + 2nd St. Campus

Key takeaways

Latin continues to outperform the DC Charter School sector average in:

- Every grade level in both ELA and Math
- Every subgroup, including by race, IEP status, STAR.
- Math performance continued to improve, with small gains in these scores.
- English performance across both schools was remarkably consistent from SY22-23 to SY 24-25.
- Gaps persist between groups at Latin, however.

Latin Pride - Parents-to-parent encouragement to donate; Brief & intensive campaign; Direct gifts to the school; Funds the PFA work for grants/events

What

Kickoff at Fall Festival Wraps by October 31

Cooper Goals - \$150,000 & 100% participation

\$600/per student suggested or what a family can afford. Gifts range from \$25-\$5,000.

We encourage families to give generously to cover inflation, program improvements, etc.

How - Volunteers

Parents contact fellow parents to encourage direct gift to school.

Volunteers work a list, making contact until a donation is made.

School receives/tracks all donations. Volunteers only learn whether a family has given, never how much.

How - Parents

Families donate one-time by check or credit card

Can donate monthly or "subscribe" online

Parents are encouraged to share with friends and family

Many companies match your donations!







Why give to Latin?

We have an expensive model, particularly our small class sizes

Charter schools are **not granted a facility** nor do
they have access to DC
government services as DCPS

Donations help us **cover unforeseen costs**, so Latin can continue to fund the most essential elements of the model.

Donations help the school fund **faculty** salaries & professional development

Family Fundraising at Latin

1. LATIN PRIDE

Started by parents, parent-to-parent encouragement to donate

Designed to be a brief, intensive campaign

Direct gifts to the school (no sales, for example)

Funds the PFA work for school: department grants, family events, and more

All \$ go to Latin!

2. BACCHANALIA

Twin goals: getting parent community together and raising \$ for Faculty Fund

Cooper did this in Spring 2023! *Parties with purpose*

Hosts donate the party; guests donate to school instead of buying a ticket

3. OTHER

Parents often support other initiatives:

- Equal Access Fund (including by paying extra for field trips)

Budget: Priorities & Decisions




Our \$25M (whole LEA) budget reflects our priorities.


- **SMALL** Commitment to small classes and maintaining a low teacher/student ratio.
- **STUDENT-FOCUSED** We prioritize funding student-facing faculty over administrators (and our admins teach!)
 - 68% on teachers
 - 12% on support personnel (deans, counselors, aides, etc.)
 - 20% on administrative faculty
- *SUPPORT* Latin has invested in academic interventionists, student support, and mental health faculty to foster all students' growth.

Expansion - Adding the Cooper Campus



Our Approach

- Grow slowly we opened with just two grades.
- Build on existing academic program, while offering campus autonomy.
- Leverage administrative team and shared resources (finance, communications, athletics).

Our Challenges

- Our model is expensive.
- Lower enrollment means we have an operational funding gap.
- DC Charter schools must pay for facilities.
