We recognize that ninth graders are striving for independence and we are working to create a school and a program that honors that.







Advisory

Credit Requirements, Community Service

- 4 credits English
- 4 credits Math
 (one year past Algebra II)
- 4 credits Science
- 4 credits History
 (including D.C. History and Government)
- 3 credits Latin (through Latin III)
- 2 credits Modern Language (through the second level)
- 3.5 credits Electives

 (credits that are above and beyond the minimum and specifically named graduation requirements and are of the student's choosing)

- 0.5 credit Art
- 0.5 credit Health
- 0.5 credit Music
- 0.25 credit Financial Literacy
- 1 credit Athletics (four seasons)
- 100 hours Community Service

Students need at least 27.25 credits to graduate!



9th Grade courses

Subjects for all 9th graders and most common courses

Honors Courses

- We will offer honors level courses this coming year in Math and Latin.
- Placement in honors courses is dependent on a number of factors, including standardized tests, final exam grade, and teacher recommendation.
- We want to ensure there are multiple pathways to honors level courses throughout the curriculum.
- We are discussing the timetable for adding other honors level courses.

Math Curriculum - Overview

 Washington Latin uses the Common Core standards to sequence all math courses from 5th grade through Algebra 2.

• Our students have the opportunity to take credit-bearing *Algebra 1 by 8th grade* and Calculus by 12th grade.

• We offer *intensive Math support* for students who demonstrate a need through diagnostic testing.





World Languages

- Current Options: Spanish and Arabic
- Future: a 3rd modern language
- **Requirements:** 2 consecutive years (For example, Arabic I and Arabic II)
- **Beyond:** All languages have 5 levels, including a chance for AP or NEWL

- *Communicative Method*: we speak the language students are learning
- **Seal of Biliteracy**: any student who can demonstrate Intermediate High proficiency in Reading, Writing, Speaking, and Listening
- **Spring break trips:** students are eligible after 3 years

Summer School & Opportunities



- Any courses taken after 8th grade that are not remedial in nature can count towards high school credit.
- In the future, we will offer the following as 2.5 week electives: Art, Music, Health, Government, and DC History.
- For 2025, summer school will be offered at 2nd Street and will mostly focus on students in need of extra support. We will also offer one of the electives mentioned above, and our summer program will grow as Cooper does.


