- Once students enter the Upper School, ***advisors also provide academic guidance by reviewing course options and supporting their students' paths towards graduation.***








Seminar

Graduation Requirements

Credit Requirements, Sports, Community Service

- 4 credits – English
- 4 credits – Math
(one year past Algebra II)
- 4 credits – Science
- 4 credits – History
(including D.C. History and Government)
- 3 credits – Latin
(through Latin III)
- 2 credits – Chinese, Spanish or Arabic
(through the second level)
- 3.5 credits – Electives
(credits that are above and beyond the minimum and specifically named graduation requirements and are of the student's choosing)
- 0.5 credit – Art
- 0.5 credit – Health
- 0.5 credit – Music
- 0.25 credit – Financial Literacy
- 1 credit – Athletics
(four seasons)
- 100 hours – Community Service

**Students need at least
27.25 credits to graduate!**





Math Curriculum - Overview

- Washington Latin uses the ***Common Core standards*** to sequence all math courses from 5th grade through Algebra 2.
- Every student has the opportunity to take credit-bearing ***Algebra 1 by 8th grade*** and Calculus by 12th grade.
- We offer ***intensive Math support*** for students who demonstrate a need through diagnostic testing.
